SECONDARY SCHOOL RUGBY COURSES

A Collaboration with New Zealand Rugby





The Learning Place delivers vocational education across Aotearoa into over 400 secondary schools annually supporting learners on their career journeys. All courses contribute to NCEA outcomes and provide essential and tangible skills for next steps to employment and tertiary training.

Partnering with New Zealand Rugby (NZR), The Learning Place has created three courses to provide an opportunity for learners involved in secondary school rugby to gain tangible subject specific skills to aid them in their career choice in rugby or a sporting career.

While two of these courses are primarily centred around skill development, all three emphasise the culture and values of passion, mutual support, fair play and a welcoming environment, as outlined in The Four Pou of Te Ara Ranga Tira / The Rugby Way.

The overarching purpose of these courses is to develop the skills and cultural awareness necessary for our rangatahi (youth), who represent the next generation of New Zealand rugby, to grow into positions of responsibility and leadership, and foster meaningful and lasting change in the sport going forward.

DELIVERY

The Learning Place comes to the school or Club to deliver the course over three days. We run courses during term time and in the school holidays. There is the potential to have the courses delivered in a flexible manner to suit the needs of the school schedule. All course are delivered by experienced Kaiako and meet The Learning Place's academic standards.

COST

Cost per learner is \$350.00.

All course delivery, assessment, credit reporting and academic standards will meet the conditions of the MOU between The Learning Place and the school.



INTRODUCTION TO RUGBY COACHING

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will be centred around an introduction to the key skills of a coach, but with wide applicability for all of those involved in New Zealand Rugby and grounded in the context of care and support of players.

Totalling 14 NCEA credits at level 3, this course will take place across three consecutive days, and will be delivered by Kaiako with personal experience in rugby coaching.

This course will aid learners in developing their understanding of coaching skills and injury prevention practice, as well as providing them with an opportunity to plan and execute their own beginnerlevel coaching session under supervision.

Learners who complete this course will be capable of planning and executing their own beginner-level coaching sessions, and will be well on their way towards a future in coaching rugby.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Year 12 and 13
- All learners are required to engage with precourse work prior to the course.
- Resources will be sent in advance to allow sufficient time for learners to understand course content, expectations and be familiar with the topics involved.
- Learners must have had previous experience in a rugby environment.



INTRODUCTION TO RUGBY REFEREEING

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Totalling 13 NCEA credits at level 3, this course will provide learners with a solid introduction to the role of a sports official, including application of rules and strategies in a refereeing context, and the importance of communication for a sports official in a rugby context.

By emphasising the importance of people management as a sports official, this three-day course will offer a range of benefits that apply to anyone interested in a future in rugby; such as communication techniques, conflict management, and strategies for promoting positive interactions in the context of sport.

By providing secondary school learners with an introduction to refereeing practice, this course will aim to foster interest amongst the next generation of potential referees and provide the skills required for secondary school students to begin their refereeing journey. Learners who complete this course will have an in-depth understanding of the role of a referee, and strategies for building trust and managing conflict both on and off the field.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Year 12 and 13 students
- All learners are required to engage with precourse work prior to the course.
- Resources will be sent in advance to allow sufficient time for learners to understand course content, expectations and be familiar with the topics involved.
- Learners must have had previous experience in a rugby environment.
